TOURS

A different Buenos Aires

Our tour guided in English and Spanish is without doubt the most interesting and entertaining way to discover Buenos Aires, learning its history and making new friends whilst enjoying a memorable experience in our city.



The Tour last approximately 3 ½ - 4 hours. We cycle on bike paths where available avoiding traffic when possible and the cycling is non-strenuous.

You will Cycle through the main quarters: El Puerto, La Reserva Ecológica, La Boca, San Telmo, Plaza San Matrn and many other interesting places.

Main highlights:

Puerto Madero

This is the newest, most expensive and most frequently visited area by porteños and tourists alike. Buenos Aires inhabitants are known as porteños (from the word "puerto" or port). Today the old docks have been restored and many of the buildings have been converted into restaurants, lofts and offices with the best view of the city.

La Reserva Ecológica

This is an area close to the city where nature and the environment have been preserved. The flora and fauna found here is closest to that which would have been seen by the first Spanish travellers.



La Boca

Historically, La Boca is a portside neighbourhood. Its particular style reflects the influence of the city's migratory influx. It is one of the birthplaces of Tango, along with its brothels and cafes. Caminito is a must for tourists to discover this unique and unforgettable place.

San Telmo

This was one of the first neighborhoods established in Buenos Aires, where aristocratic families settled before the yellow fever epidemic of 1871 broke out. As time passed the big houses became "conventillos" (buildings packed with families of squatters). Today it is a must in order to understand the historical heritage of the city.

Plaza de Mayo

Since the foundation of Buenos Aires, the Plaza de Mayo has been the backdrop for all the important political events in Argentina.

Recoleta – Palermo Tour

The tour lasts approximately 3 ½ hours.

We cycle through

Barrio Norte, Recoleta, el Cementerio, Palermo, El Rosedal, campo Argentino de Polo, el Hipódromo, Los Bosque de Palermo, Barrio Parque and many other interesting places.

Main highlights:

Recoleta

This residential district is famous for its French style buildings, large parks, exclusive thoroughfares, up market bars and first rate restaurants.

Palermo Woods (Rosedal)

The Palermo Woods are the lungs of Buenos Aires. On weekends, streets become pedestrian zones and over 400 rose bushes are on display in the Rose Garden.

Barrio Parque

A residential area characterized by its mansions, parks, embassies and ambassadors' residences.

Tigre – San Isidro tour

Our tour guided in English and Spanish is without doubt the most interesting and entertaining way to discover Buenos Aires, learning its history and making new friends whilst enjoying a memorable experience in our city.



The tour lasts approximately 4½ - 5 hours. We ride on bike paths where available avoiding traffic when possible and the riding is non-strenuous. We ride through: Tigre, El Puerto de Frutos, San Isidro, Barrancas de Acassuso, Olivos and much, much more.

Main highlights:

Tigre

This is an island surrounded by the rivers Reconquista, Tigre and Luján situated in the region called Delta del Paraná. Here we can observe rowing clubs, typical residential areas and a very active river life



Fruit Market

One of the Delta's main spots where cane furniture, bamboo baskets, fruits and natural products from the Delta are sold.

San Isidro

Originally this was a farming area. Elegant and tree-lined, this is now a residential area with narrow pavements and cobbled streets. Here we will explore this historical neighborhood, San Isidro Cathedral and the riverbank where we can find sport clubs and restaurants with excellent views.
